Senior Men's Football Directors Report 2023

Another season has come and gone, with plenty of ups and downs throughout the season with the B grade and the C Grade playing in the grand final unfortunately for the B Grade it was only the C Grade team that took out the win.

In the A Grade, we saw a return to the club of Senior Coach Kieran Sporn for another shot of unfinished business, assisted by Alex Scott, Sam Venning and Peter Lewis. With the addition of several recruits including Sam Davis and Matt Walton, hoping to take the boys to the top of the ladder.

The team had a season hit by injuries and rolled 48 players through the team throughout the season with only two players playing every game. We started the season with a wake up Loss away to Mt Lofty, followed by a couple of wins and by half way through the season we where could only manage 3 wins, the second half of the season showed some improvement with 4 wins and a draw and the team started to play as a unit. Female Football Report 2023

In season 2023 we entered two sides in the HFL Open Women's competition for the first time. The HFL set rules around our two teams playing in the one competition stating that our best selected 16 players were ONLY allowed to be selected in our Green Team.

Preseason saw several experienced players recruited to the club in a busy transfer season which added to a young squad full of talent.

The decision was made to combine our U17.5 Girls teams and Women's teams for preseason which worked well increasing player numbers at training and improving relationships between senior and junior players.

Our Green Team coached by Simon Manser and captained by Kelsey Clare played as our first selected team and the White Team coached by Corey Drew and captained by Katilyn Hill played as our second selected side.

Our aim at the start of the year was for our Green Team to be very competitive and push towards finals, and for our White team was to be competitive in all games against the first selected sides of all opposition.

At the end of the minor round Blackwood Green had played 14 games and won 12 of those games and finished second on the ladder, a Great result!

Blackwood White had also played 14 games for the season and won 4 of those games, finishing 8th on the ladder. As stated, the Blackwood White team played against first selected teams all year and to win 4 games, including a win over Nairne, and a close result against Hahndorf, was a tremendous effort.

The Blackwood Green team's finals campaign could not have started any better with wins against Mount Lofty in the Qualifying Final by 40 points and a win against Onkaparinga in the Semi by 35 points seeing them qualify for their second Grand Final in as many years.

Grand Final Day held at Uraidla saw the Blackwood Green team come up against a tough Mount Lofty opponent. Blackwood Green, well supported by the other senior and junior teams of the club were far to strong for Mount Lofty winning the game by 43 points. Zoe Venning was named Best on Ground. Georgie Pater was another great contributor on the day, as was Beth Sigley, Megan Rich, and Bella Drew.

After a bumpy start to the Junior season for a number of teams, all teams settled into the groove of a new season playing some exceptional football across the grades.

Largely the season ran smoothly for BFC, with the club gaining high ratings for players and coaches throughout the season, with a few minor issues in coaching behaviour across a couple of teams. These were dealt with via SANFL and internal club processes. Coaching behaviour is still, and will always be a major focus for the Junior programs, as the younger players look up to and feed off the coaches energy, so it is an important aspect that always need to be monitored and attended to.

The Juniors have strong numbers across most age groups, with the U9/11 girls and U13/14 boys being the teams most struggling for players. However, the future is bright with 177 players in our Sub Junior programs from U7-U11. While early on it was looking like the U10 Boys would not be able to fill 2 teams, we successfully managed to get both teams across the line. Similarly, the U11 Boys looked like they were going to have to field a team in the 15 a side SANFL competition, but once again, we managed to field a side in the 18 a side competition. The Girls U9 and U11 teams also struggled for players throughout the season but managed to put teams on the park each week in a stellar effort.

The premiership grade Junior teams had extremely successful seasons, with ALL premiership grade teams, Boys and Girls, making the finals in SANFL and HFL competitions. This is an amazing effort and cannot be done without the excellent coaching, team support and dedication of the coaches, team managers, other volunteers, and players. Unfortunately, none of the Girls teams made Grand Finals, nor did the U14 Boys team, who suffered some significant late season injuries. All other Boys teams made Grand Finals and while none won the Premiership for their grade, they acquitted themselves extremely well, an effort for which they should all be proud.

Three events specifically for Juniors were held throughout the season, these being the Come & Try day, which was hugely successful and will be run earlier in 2024 than it was this year, the Juniors Quiz Night and a Junior Disco. This is a conscious effort on the club's part to bring our Juniors more into the club, as our Juniors are our future Senior players. The Juniors Quiz Night was extremely well attended, and very well received by those who came to the night. Once again, we plan to run this event again next year, bigger and better than 2023! In addition, new Sub Junior Coordinator, Melissa Riseley organised a Juniors Disco that once again was very well attended and received by families. Melissa (with the help of Sophie Gust) did an excellent job of organising and running the night and we look forward to this event happening again in 2024.

Treasurers Report 2023

This year has been a difficult year due to increasing costs. We increased some bar prices, barbeque, canteen and player memberships (by CPI) to offset the increases.

It is a balancing act to break even on a cash basis which was roughly the case this year. We aim to keep the cost of player memberships as reasonable as we can.

The profit and loss shows a significant loss due mainly to depreciation, which is a write-off of facility upgrade costs over a number of years. The main items being tables, chairs, lighting, coaches box items, gym equipment and player guernseys. If we have upgrades to be done in future we will need to fund raise, and where applicable apply for grants to cover the cash required.

Cleaning costs appear high this year, as the previous cleaner could no longer do our cleaning with the new cleaner was more expensive, and the cost for wash room supplies also increased.

Medical expenses, which includes tapes was affected by CPI and cost increases

SANFL umpire fees increased by \$4K compared to last year and HFL umpires up by \$6K from last year

Wages for the bar staff increased mainly due to basic wage rate increases and less volunteer hours,



We also spent an additional amount for strength training

Match expenses includes filming of games and match day sponsor vouchers for best players.

A big thankyou to our bookkeeper Lorna Cole for managing the accounting system.
