Senior Football Directors Report 2021

Well, another season of football has drawn to a conclusion. Despite the continued challenges of playing a physical sport in a Covid environment, it has been another successful season for the Blackwood Football Club Senior Football Department with individual players growing to become better footballers, all sides playing some great team orientated football and the Senior Colts achieving the ultimate success, winning the premiership.

In the Men's A Grade, Scott Prebble took over the reigns of side being appointed as club coach. The off-field staff also saw the experienced Craig Bahnisch jump onboard as assistant coach whilst the club invested in the medical department with the Physio Studio (through Anneka Smith) becoming the Club Physiotherapist.

With the addition of several new recruits and senior colts stepping into the Men's program for the first time, the team started like a house on fire first winning seven of the first nine matches. As the season wore on, injuries continued to mount which impacted the ability for the side to be at fullstrength with over 200 games missed by players through injuries at the end of the year.

With change comes opportunity, with several players given the chance to play a sustained period in the A Grade and show what they could do. Across the season 11 players made their Men's A Grade debut for the club (Alex Scott, Caleb Dearman, Ed Van Den Berg, Jaxin Faehrmann, Jordon Cock, Lachlan Bahnisch, Patrick Hillard, Oscar Hodge, Sam Venning, Tyson Clark and Zac Venning) with all players showing they will be long term quality footballers in the Red and Green.

The side ended up finishing in fifth position at the end of the minor rounds with a nine-and-seven record suffering a loss to Onkaparinga Valley in the Elimination Final at Lobethal Oval. The side averaged the fourth best offence in the competition (71.4 points) whilst the defence was rated fifth best (69.0 points). Individual highlights for the year included Nathan Dunn winning the 2021 Moulden Medal finishing eight votes ahead of Daniel Benson in second



place whilst captain Ryan Dijksman took home the leading goal kicker award.

Season 2021 saw the Blackwood Football Club field two Senior Women's sides for the first time. The club entered one team in the Division Two Adelaide Football League competition playing on Saturday afternoon whilst the senior team played in the Hills Football League competition on Sunday's. The A Grade side hit the ground running winning their opening two matches against Flinders University and Salisbury and had four wins from the opening seven matches. As the season wore on, the team suffered from several key injuries and unavailability to unfortunately not win a match in the last seven games of the season.

With injuries and unavailability hitting the first team, the Hills Football League side bore the brunt of this with several players often having to play two matches across the season. The B Grade side finished with two wins from 10 matches with wins coming against Murraylands in Round 6 and Onkaparinga Valley in Round 7.

Moving off the season, the club had its first every Women's player being drafted into the AFLW system with Jess Good being selected by the Carlton Football Club. We wish Jess all the best and will be barracking hard whenever the Blues take the field in 2022. Other individual highlights across the season include Tamika May and Kiera Mueller winning the best and fairest awards from Michaela Collins and Claudia Cock whilst Brieanna Medder took home both leading goal kicker awards. Thank you to all the coaches, trainers and volunteers for assisting across the season.

In the B Grade, Daniel Lowe continued as coach of the team for the second consecutive season. Making a slow start to the season winning one of their first four matches, they found their groove recording wins in 11 of the next 14 games to finish in third position on the ladder. The side battled hard across three finals making it to the preliminary final to lose in a tight battle by six points to Mt Barker at Echunga Oval. The side saw continued improvement from many younger players with many showing they will be quality long-term players for the Woods. Overall highlights included Liam McCarthy winning the best and fairest ahead of Bailey Badcoe whilst Jacob Broad made a successful return to football picking up the player of the finals award. Thank you to all those who assisted the team in all the volunteer roles across the season.

Season 2021 also saw the return of the C Grade Mens side with the team entered in the C3 competition of the Adelaide Football League. The team had a tough start to the season losing to Flinders Park, but it served as a



wake-up call as the team put in the commitment to improve and that paid dividends as they finished in fourth position on the ladder after the conclusion of the minor rounds. Facing eventual premiers Golden Grove in the Preliminary Final, the side lead at quarter time but was unable to sustain the intensity being over-run to eventually lose the match. A special thanks must go to Rob Jones, Gary Reynolds, Brendan Pole and John Ghee who put their hands to ensure the side had coaches, a trainer and timekeeper/goal umpire.

Individual highlights for the year included Nathan Dunn winning the best and fairest ahead of Connor McCarl whilst Tyson Aiston took home the leader goal kicker award and finished runner up in the Competition best player medal.

For the Senior Colts, they bounced back from the disappointment in the previous year to claim the ultimate prize, the 2021 Hills Football League Premiership. Jacob Broad assumed the coaching role for his second season as a coach with fellow senior player Daniel Bennetts assisting him. Across the season, the side had a 13-and-3 record to finish second on the ladder. The side recorded two victories over Onkparinga Valley to qualify for the Grand Final but turned around a semi-final loss against Nairne to record the team's first premiership side 2017. The Senior Colts have had a successful period across the last four seasons making the Grand Final on four of five occasions. Across the season the side used a total of 36 players and ranked as the best attack and second-best defence. Congratulations to Sam Matters who took out the best and fairest award ahead of Ben Wender.

Moving forward into 2022, the senior playing group (both Men's and Women's) are in an exciting position. With a solid core of outstanding players steered by exceptional leaders, both groups have the drive to be the best footballers they can be. There is a real opportunity for a period of sustained success just around the corner. Bring on next season!

Season 2021 saw the introduction of our sub junior grades enter the SANFL Juniors (no premiership points) competitions.

The established age groups – U12, 13, 15 & 17.5 all continued to progress in the premiership age groups with only our U13 girls & U17.5 division 2 teams not participating in finals football. All three HFL boys' junior teams also participated in finals football with our U14 lads finishing 4th, U16's 3rd and of course the excellent U18 premiership in 2021.

The early focus centred around ensuring quality coaches with a development mind set for our strong numbers to continue to improve individually but also within their respective teams/ squads. Our female junior program continues to grow with Damien Venning constantly recruiting and driving the ability for all to play and improve. A great example of a club (legend) volunteer who always puts the BFC first!



Luke Gunn coordinated the large Auskick centre with great support on Friday nights from many helpers both junior and senior BFC players and of course parental help also. Matt Thomas took on the U7 minis coaching role and created a fun environment for entry level competitive football.

Jarrod Trowbridge and Will Darley looked after the U8's squads and Annie Boyd & Clare Collins (welcome to coaching girls) both open women players from the BFC guided our U9 girls. Nathan Mitchell and Braden Williss coached our U10 boys with Tavis Kleinig mentoring the U9 boys.

Mark Sansome oversaw the U11 girls and provides a great environment for this age group to learn the game, Aaron Harrison coached our U11 boys with a focus on teaching the game and the improvement became evident throughout the season. Adam Torode coached the U12 boys and continues his journey of many seasons coaching at the BFC in various age groups. Damien Connor continued with the U13 boys following their U12 premiership the previous year 2020. Scott Wheatland was reappointed to the U14 (HFL) moving with the squad from the SANFL Juniors U13's the previous season. Cam Grigg led the U15 boys team following a later than expected start for this group and uncertainty around who would coach the team in season 2021. Luke Warburton coached the U16's with great support and assistance from Zac Venning. Luke Hall & Rik Falch worked with our strong U13 girl's squads and Dan Smith continued with the U15 girls. Ashley Bryans and Simon Manser were responsible for our most senior junior group of U17.5 girls and certainly had some challenges throughout with numbers and many girls playing two games every if not most weekend.

Through regular conversation with Damien Venning, we knew that this would be challenging but also had a strong belief that the more football our juniors are able to play will assist with greater development, exposure to different coaching techniques and of course at times playing in the age group higher. The highlight being Jackson Moody winning the Best & Fairest in both the U14 (HFL) and U15 SANFL teams. Another highlight within the junior ranks was U16 co-captain Callum Finlayson winning the HFL Mail Medal followed by selection in the U18 Grand Final who ultimately won the premiership. Congratulations to both Jackson and Callum for your outstanding seasons! No doubt we'll see these lads making their way through higher ranks in seasons to come! Also, to so many of the girls playing multiple games each weekend be that in similar fashion to Jackson but also many were exposed to playing some open women's football which will hold them in good stead moving into more senior ranks in seasons to come.

Thank you and great appreciation must also go to Lulu Collins & Dustin Fisher who both continue to support the BFC as parents of players but also the



outstanding work they both do co-ordinating their respective age levels, Lulu with the sub juniors/ not for premiership grades and Dustin as the SANFL Juniors boys. Damien Venning as mentioned previously has also done an outstanding job with the female football program since its inception some 5 years ago!

I would also like to thank the many assistant coaches, team managers, trainers and first aid support staff for their efforts in making sure games were rolled out smoothly and all participants were treated as important members of the Blackwood Football Club.

Ruth Work puts more time in than many can imagine with the absolute focus of keeping players healthy and well and able to play and train each week. Thank you, Ruth.

Whilst I was keen to ensure we were open for business whenever there were games being played at the BFC I'd like to thank the many helpers/ parents/ grand parents and siblings who volunteered with BBQ and canteen duty.

The importance to cater for visiting teams/ clubs will ultimately leave a good memory for their next journey to Blackwood. I'm sure most have experienced significant travel only to find no catering which can be attributed to lack of voluntary support or minimal games being played on any given day.

The need for further assistance is necessary and all it takes is a couple of dedicated hours whenever you are able!

We were fortunate to pretty much play full seasons across all age levels/ grades in season 2021 besides a longer than expected break in July's lock down. An impressive result for all involved who assisted with ground Marshall and covid Marshall duties. This included many hard-working committee members who spent many hours around the club and away from the club dealing with related matters that arise from time to time.
