Senior Football Directors Report 2022

Another football season comes and goes at the blink of an eye! Season 2022 saw plenty of ups and downs in the Senior Football program with the season highlighted by four of five sides playing finals including the A Grade Women's & C Grade side making it to the Grand Final (unfortunately both sides fella short at the final hurdle) and the Senior Colts achieving the ultimate success, winning the premiership, their second season in a row for doing so.

In the Men's A Grade, Scott Prebble continued as coach for a second season and was assisted Craig Bahnisch, Alex Scott, and Jake Atkinson. With the addition of several recruits including Ben Adams and Jack Lewis along



several players stepping up into the side from the 2021 Senior Colt group, the side started the season well winning four of the first five matches.

The group continued to push hard including winning against Hahndorf at home in Round 7, the first time beating them since the famous 2017 Grand Final. However, as the season wore on, injuries and unavailability continued to mount results in the side winning three of the last 12 matches finishing the season with an eight-and-ten record. The A Grade finished the season off playing in an elimination final against Uraidla Districts at Callington Oval. Unfortunately, the side was unsuccessful on the day making it the fourth time in the past five seasons the team has been eliminated from finals in the first week. Across the season, the side saw a total of 42 players pull on the guernsey including 15 debuts . The side ranks as the ninth best offensive unit in the competition (69.7 points) whilst the defence was rated seventh best (88.2 points). Individual highlights for the year included Ben Adams winning the 2022 Moulden Medal finishing 100 votes ahead of Matt Waldron in second place while recruit Jack Lewis took home the leading goal kicker award.

I must say thank you to Scott Prebble who steps down from the role after two seasons in charge. His dedication and commitment to the job has been second to none and his blooding of 26 players in the A Grade across these seasons will no doubt reap the rewards in the long term. I look forward to seeing Chloe and Scott around in the club in the future.

In the Women's program, a decision was made in pre-season to move back to only one side playing in the HFLW competition. Coached by Damien Venning with Mike Attiwill assisting, the side made it through to the Grand Final having solid finals run with victories against Mt Lofty and Onkaparinga Valley. Unfortunately, they just fell short in the last game against Uraidla Districts, but the club should be extremely proud of their on-field performances across the season. The dedication and passion all the Women's players show for the red and green is second to none.

The club had its second Women's player being drafted into the AFLW system with Keira Mueller being selected by the Adelaide Crows making her debut on 21 October at Unley Oval. Other individual highlights across the season include Gretel Ramsey winning the best and fairest award from Saraid Kustermann whilst Brieanna Medder took home the leading goal kicker award. Thank you to all the coaches, trainers, and volunteers for assisting across the season.

In the B Grade, Daniel Lowe continued as coach of the team for the third consecutive season. It was a tough season for the side with long term injuries and availability hurting the on-field results. Across the season, the side had a



total of 62 players pull on the guernsey with no players managing to play every game. The side started the season in a quick fashion winning four of the first five matches by an average of 35 points having a lean run through the middle of the season winning one of six matches between Rounds 5 and 11 however bounced back with four wins on the trot from Round 12 to 15.

Unfortunately, three losses to end the season saw the team miss the finals finishing in sixth position with a nine-and-nine record. While team ranked as fifth best offensive and defence in the competition, they could only record two wins from 10 matches against the eventual top five sides with the eight losses coming at an average of five goals. Overall, the side saw continued improvement from many younger players with many showing they will be quality long-term players for the Woods. Individual highlights included new player Kyle Hummel winning the best and fairest ahead of Cody Padroth who was in his first season of senior football. Thank you to all those who assisted the team in all the volunteer roles across the season.

Season 2022 also saw the return of the C Grade Men's side return to the HFL competition with Adam Pope returning to the coaching ranks for the first time since 2017. Playing majority of matches on Friday or Saturday nights, the team started the season with four wins on the trot losing in Round 5 to Nairne Bremer. With unavailability in the top grades, the side often played matches with only 18 players including some senior colts. Finishing the season in third position, the side recorded big finals victories over Mt Barker and Hahndorf to face off against Nairne Bremer in the Grand Final. Unfortunately for the side they were unable to record a victory in the big dance. Individual highlights for the year included Alex Hopkins winning the best and fairest ahead of Connor McCarl whilst captain Patrick Mackay took home the leader goal kicker award.

For the Senior Colts, claimed the ultimate prize, the 2022 Hills Football League Premiership, the second season in a row which they have done so. Daryl Sowerby assumed the coaching role for his first season at the helm as a coach with Luke Warburton assisting him.

Across the season, the side had a 14-and-2 record to finish second on the ladder. The side recorded two victories over Mt Lofty and Mt Barker to qualify for the Grand Final and eventually beat the Devils by 12 points in tough conditions at Nairne Oval. The second consecutive Grand Final victory continues the successful period for the group making the Grand Final on five of six occasions. Across the 2022 season, the side used a total of 36 players and ranked as the best attack and third-best defence. Congratulations to



Aaron Ramsey who took out the best and fairest award ahead of Caleb McCormick.

Moving forward into 2023, the senior playing group (both Men's and Women's) are in a position where they must turn opportunity into success. With a solid core of local players, both groups must continue to press hard to make themselves the best footballers and leaders they can be. Success is just around the corner with a little bit of hard work.

Finally, I must say thank you for allowing me the opportunity to be the Senior Football Director for the past three seasons and on the committee for the last six. It has been a massive learning experience and I have enjoyed my time along the way. The Blackwood Football Club is a great club to be apart of and I look forward to continuing being around the club showing my support the red and green. Go Woods!

Junior Football Directors Report 2022

Firstly, I'd like to thank Dave Richardson and the Executive Committee for giving me the opportunity to return to the Blackwood Football Club as Junior Football Director for season 2022.

Having never been involved in a football club committee prior to this season, it was a fairly steep learning curve. Luckily for me, I had the support of our executive committee led by President Dave Richardson and Vice President Leonie Wilmshurst. They helped me adjust to the demands of the role and were always available for a chat when needed.

I have had the luxury of working with some fantastic coordinators throughout the year. Dustin Fisher (SANFL Juniors Boys), Damien Venning (Girls Program) and Lulu Collins (Sub Juniors). These guys have made my job a lot more manageable, due to their knowledge and expertise in their respective roles.

At the start of the season, we wanted to focus on our junior coaches' behavior and coaching methods. This was done by a couple of coaches information sessions where coaches were asked to fill out and sign a Coaches Code of Conduct. Scott Prebble, who was the A Grade Coach at the time ran through what coaches of different age groups should be focusing on. This differs from younger grades to the older grades. This was received well by most coaches, but disappointingly there were a few who didn't make it to either session. This is something that I will be looking to rectify for season 2023.

We were lucky enough to have Luke Gunn as our Auskick Coordinator again in season 2022. Luke has grown his numbers from 80 Auskickers last year, to 105 auskickers this year. Luke has done an amazing job with this group and somehow, within the chaos that 105 kids bring has his program run like clockwork. I know Luke was supported by a fantastic group of parents who were more than happy to assist where needed.

There were 90 registered Sub Juniors over 7 teams, in what was a successful SANFL Juniors season. Running U7 teams has offered a great entry point into the football club for our Auskickers. Going forward next season, we'd like to host more Sub Junior home games on a Friday night and welcome our youngest players and their families into the Blackwood Football Club



This last season saw a number of our teams playing for premiership points in both Boys and Girls programs take part in finals football. This is due to the fantastic coaches and support staff we have at our disposal. This culminated in our U14 team coached by Damion Connor and our U16 team coached by Jack Smedley winning both the Courier Cups and Premierships.

As with all clubs, we can only exist if our members and families put their hands up to help out. There are a number of roles that need to be filled on a weekly basis including, canteen helpers, BBQ, oval set up and pack up, goal and boundary umpires, time keepers etc. While the support given throughout the year has been fairly good most weeks, we need to ensure that if you are asked to help, or are rostered on to help, then you help out by doing your bit. It's hard enough running the teams as it is and team managers/coaches/coordinators and the club in general would really appreciate your assistance.

It has been a busy, yet rewarding season for me as Junior Football Director, U16 Coach and proud parent. This is because at the Blackwood Football Club, we have what I believe to be one of the best groups of junior volunteers and families in the competition. It is my goal going forward to create the best junior program for both boys and girls outside of the SANFL and SANFLW. This will only be possible if we work together as a team.

In summary, the future looks bright for the Blackwood Football Club for season 2023 and beyond.

Treasurers Report 2022

The below shows the main factors in the reported loss for this year and differences to last year. There were \$15K costs from last year in this years' result and income was down on what we expected.

- This year had 2 more games than last year as we had a covid shutdown last year, this means player and coach payments were not incurred for those 2 rounds last year.
- Last year we received \$11K covid related government support which was not repeated this year.
- Player memberships were \$9K less than expected as we had a fee increase but less players registered



- Bar sales were about \$40K less than expected, as we increased prices. This impacted the result by about \$20K unfavourable
- Barbeque sales were also less than expected \$5K, impact \$2.5K unfavourable.
- Sponsorship goods in lieu was down by \$20K, but this is offset in match day expenses. This includes complimentary gym memberships. Other sponsorships were in line with last year.
- Wages for bar staff including on costs increased by \$29K as we used less volunteers. Bar staff are required to have RSA training (responsible service of alcohol). We increased bar prices to cover this.
- We had 2 years of insurance in this year \$9K unfavourable
- Trainers costs \$9K higher. We needed to hire paid physio/trainers.
- Last year and this year presentation functions were included in this year, but this was offset by the income for both years also in this year.
- This year included trophy and photograph costs from last year \$6K
- Vouchers cost \$10K greater than last year. This now records all complimentary costs that were previously unrecorded.
- Gas costs \$4K above last year due to price increases.
- Other operating costs generally increased by CPI

This year was affected by reduced attendances, believed to be mainly due to covid which impacted Axeman's attendances and diminished club support for visiting teams when we had home games.

Alcohol, canteen and barbeque input costs have increased, so we will need to review prices again for next season.

And a big thankyou to our bookkeeper Julie Langham for managing the accounting system.
