Senior Men's Football Directors Report 2024

Another season has come and gone, with plenty of ups and downs throughout the season with C Grade playing in the grand final unfortunately not taking home the win against the strength of Hahndorf, the B grade made it into the finals but not to the big dance.

In the A Grade, we saw a second season for the Senior Coach Kieran Sporn with the help of Clyde Rigney as his senior assistant. Preseason was ran by Daniel "Buckets" Lowe and A grade Captain Matt Waldron after Kieren had some serious health issues.

The team had a season hit by injuries and rolled 40+ players through the team through out the season with only six players playing every game. We started the season confident and positive only to have our best midfielder hit by long term injuries, Sam Davis, Matt Tuck and Rhys Sporn which really put us under the pump and tested the strength and depth of the team. Kieren Sporn health then was not improving and as per doctors orders he stood down as the senior coach, luckily for us Clyde stepped up and took control, which we thank him for. The end of the season we finish 8th with only 2 wins, we played better than this looked in patches but couldn't play the 4 quarters at the intensity that was required. The positives where the games that we have put into our juniors, we must remember that the majority of the boys in this team have played less than 50 senior games. The youth and talent that we are seeing coming through the team and the commitment from the coaching group to play youth and develop these players.

The B Grade lead by Daniel Lowe and assisted late in the year by Damien Venning had a great year coming home with 9 wins prior to the finals where they beat Mt Lofty at Lofty in a close 7 point win, to go onto play Uraidla only to loss this by 16 points.

The C Grade under the control of the maestro Adam Pope also had a great year on and off the field, after a lot of negotiating trying to arrange timeslots that suit everyone early, in the end they took on the mantra they will play whoever whenever and they wont to win! finishing the season with 14 wins and 0 losses moving into the finals, they meet a strong Hahndorf side at Onkas on a Friday night, going down by 18 points at the final siren.


Simon Manser again took over the reins of the Green team and Corey Drew took the job of coaching our White team.

2024 End of Year Report by Tricia Franks, General Member of the Committee of Management

Working With Children Checks

For the first time, this year we've made good use of the SA Government Department for Human Services Screening Unit portal. We now have records of Working with Children Checks (WWCC) for 109 volunteers and paid persons stored safely on the portal. This should streamline the process for ensuring WWCCs are in place at the beginning of each playing season from now. The portal automatically alerts us when WWCCs are due to expire soon, so that we can prompt people to make sure that their checks are updated as required. We will continue to work towards achieving full WWCC coverage for the Club.

Mitcham Council Grant

Thanks to the Mitcham Council Community Facilities Grant, we received \$5500 towards the total cost (\$12,028.50 incl. GST) of updating the access control system for the clubrooms. Rohan Clark worked with Security House of SA to deliver the upgrade in August.

Strategic Planning with CLUBMAP

We engaged Terry Dillon and the CLUBMAP team https://clubmap.com.au to assist us to build strategy around the Club's operations. CLUBMAP delivered a Club Health Check and two 2-hour online workshops across August and September. They also prepared draft Strategic, Operational and Revenue Plans as well as an Implementation Plan and a draft Organisational Structure. CLUBMAP will continue to support us over the next 12 months with specific advice (at request) and general resources accessible on demand through their online Resources Hub. Our current focus is to develop the Organisational Structure by: (1) working out how all of the different jobs that need doing can be partitioned into roles, then (2) describing how the roles will interconnect with the Committee of Management through subcommittees.

BLACKWOOD FOOTBALL CLUB FINANCIAL REPORTS

Investing in Our Communities (IiOC) Grant Project Committee Report to AGM, November 2024

The Blackwood Football Club (BFC) IiOC Grant Agreement was signed on 4 March 2024. A project committee of exceptionally qualified and dedicated volunteers was assembled and has been meeting regularly since 18 March 2024 to discuss the overall project scope and required actions to achieve a successful outcome.

The final project activities under the executed grant agreement include:

- Upgrade to external power supply to the site and main switchboard,
- Upgrade sports lighting to a minimum of 100 lux,
- Supply and install poles and netting to secure backstop nets behind both goal areas,
- Document a 'whole-of-site' drainage and irrigation design for the oval and area in front of the clubhouse; and
- Install drainage and water management to the lawn area in front of the clubhouse.

The overall grant fund amount is \$614,000 (ex GST) paid in milestone payments, and a separate BFC bank account has been set up to manage the financial accountability to the Commonwealth.

The grant agreement is directly between the Commonwealth and BFC, which has created some complexity with the club only being a tenant of the site. This has resulted in lengthy and

ongoing negotiations with the City of Mitcham (CoM) as property owner, and while council have been very supportive, the extended stakeholder group and contacts within council for approval has delayed some of the original planned timelines.

A variation to the grant timelines was approved by the Commonwealth on 11 August 2024, with main change being a revision to the project completion date from 1 October 2025 to 1 April 2026. This will allow coordination with the Coromandel Cricket Club (CCC) for undertaking any oval works to minimise the impact for all parties.

To date, all required milestone dates and reporting to the Commonwealth have been achieved and the status of each project element is listed below:

- Netting: Exiis Group to commence site works 21 November 2024.
- **Site Drainage & Irrigation Design:** Engineers report and cost estimates expected before the end of November 2024.
- **Site Power Upgrade:** Engineer's investigations completed, currently coordinating final cost estimates and timing for the works with SA Power Networks.
- **Oval Lighting:** Engineer's investigations confirmed the condition and performance of the existing luminaires and light towers will enable them to be retained and lighting levels guaranteed through the power upgrade.

Following the engineering investigations, the power and lighting upgrade costs will be less than originally expected, and the committee is hopeful some oval drainage and irrigation works might be achieved from the existing grant funds. The Commonwealth has been advised of this through the reporting process and will monitor any scope change to a successful outcome for all parties.

Mike Angley, Simon Manser and Martin Rawley have volunteered their time and have graciously added their decades of project knowledge and skills to the club. The Blackwood Football Club thanks these men for their time and dedication.

Treasurers Report 2024

2024 had many challenges for the Blackwood Football Club, including ensuring that the Club returned to an operating surplus. After posting losses in seasons 2022 and 2023, I'm proud to report that the Club has posted a trading surplus of \$39,345 (including depreciation expense of \$29,011).

Posting a surplus for season 2024 was one of the key objectives of the finance sub-committee as well as the entire Committee of Management. It has been difficult in recent years for the Club to post trading surpluses in an ever-increasing cost environment as well as being sensitive to the price of club memberships, bar and canteen prices.

This year the Club took the difficult and unpopular decision to increase bar prices across all line items. Price increases were necessary to reflect the bi-annual beer excise imposition as well as the increasing wholesale cost of alcohol that the Club could no longer absorb. This was also a pre-emptive measure at the time, as with every year, it is hard to determine what income, attendances, events, sponsorship and trading will occur during a season.

For the third year in a row, not through a lack of effort, sponsorship income fell, reflecting the difficult nature of maintaining corporate sponsorship from the community and broader Blackwood Football Club networks. The future financial success of the Club will depend on Club sponsorship returning to levels of \$100,000 to \$110,000 per annum. The Committee of Management has been looking into implementing a new system to track and monitor members' support for our sponsors, increased sponsors benefits and surety and a reward return back to our members.

Membership income in financial year 2024 includes \$15,000 of Department of Recreation and Sport – Sport Voucher Credit from financial year 2023. This income won't be replicated in financial year 2025.

However, the key reason underlying an operating surplus in financial year 2024 has been the reduction in operating costs of the club. Wage expenses have fallen dramatically, and this is almost entirely due to the super efforts of Secretary, Trevor Prentice, who has volunteered countless hours at the club this year, including behind the bar. Trevor's laser focus on cost control has seen a reduction in purchasing costs for the canteen, cleaning, and gas costs, just to name a few.

Just like focusing on increasing sponsorship revenue in financial year 2025, the Club will need to increase its volunteer pool to keep wage expenses to a minimum. Once again, your Committee will focus on the hire of a part-time Club Facilities Manager to assist in the running of the Club, control costs and focus on generating hire and external party revenue streams.

Our Balance Sheet includes \$133,513 in Cash at Bank – Business Cash Reserves and \$111,500 in Unspent Grant Fund liabilities. These funds relate to Grant funding received for the oval drainage and netting upgrade. These funds will be realised as the Grants are acquitted.

Thank you to all our volunteers who have assisted in keeping costs down and driving revenue up! Once again Cindy in the canteen with her team of volunteers, Leonie and The Axemen, Zoe in opening new merchandise lines, the Thursday night meals team and Gel for leading grass roots fundraising and Ladies Day Functions. All efforts from all our volunteers have assisted in the Club being in an improved financial position.

Finally, the finance subcommittee of, Tracy Ghee, Billy Powell, Lorna Cole (our bookkeeper) Trevor Prentice and Kym Bond (part year) – thank you for all your efforts this year and being prepared to make the tough decisions for the future financial viability of the Club.
